

## Fall Protection Competent Person Training

OSHA-mandated training for your fall protection program



### Course Description

According to OSHA standards, a Competent Person is someone who has the knowledge, experience, and authority to identify hazards, implement corrective measures, and ensure safety compliance at a worksite. Under regulations like OSHA 1926.32(f) for construction or OSHA 1910 for general industry, having a trained Competent Person on-site is not optional—it's a legal requirement to ensure safe work environments. OSHA also mandates that Competent Person training must be renewed every two years to maintain a current knowledge of safety protocols.

This two-day course trains participants on the essential components of a fall protection program and develops the skills required to become a Competent Person. Attendees will engage in a blend of classroom instruction and hands-on workshops to gain the ability to assess hazards, select appropriate systems, and manage safety measures.

Participants can include employers, supervisors, safety personnel, workers, and rescuers involved in a managed fall protection program. The course provides a thorough and engaging learning experience that equips students with the knowledge and confidence to ensure compliance and protect workers at height.
